

9MM M1910 GLISENTI

The Italians seem to have been very fond of their semi-automatic pistols as they kept some of them in service for long periods for no apparent reason. Mind you they are quite good and well made pistols. The Model 1910 Glisenti is a reduced velocity version of the 9mm Parabellum. The higher velocity parabellum cartridge should not be used in the Glisenti weapon. The cartridge appears to have been made between 1910 and 1934.

This cartridge was also applied to the M1915 pistol (7.65mm).
