

## GRENADE HAND OR RIFLE No. 54

This grenade was originally known as the “CSOF grenade” standing for Chief Superintendent Ordnance Factories. It was introduced in January 1923 and declared obsolete in November 1935.

It was made from cast iron, filled with Baratol 80/20 and fuzed with an allways fuze of the No. 247 style. It weighed .49 kg.

It could be thrown or launched from a 50mm discharger cup attached to an SMLE rifle.



The Mk II differed from the Mk I in having a single pointed striker needle and an improved detonator and waterproofing.
