

GRENADe SIGNAL No. 65

This grenade was introduced in September 1940 and was and still is used by naval forces throughout the world.

It is similar in dimensions, functioning and operation to the No. 57 to 63 grenades.

It could be launched from either the Webley & Scott 2 1/2 inch signal pistol or the Float, signal, submerged (Grenade) Mk N3/1

It would appear that the grenade signal is different in construction from the grenade used in the float although the launching instructions indicate that the No. 65 can be used in both.

It has a paper lined tinned-plate body the top of which is embossed with a cross to indicate a red signal and a triangle a green signal. The top was also stenciled "Load into discharger this way up".
