

7.92x107 POLISH ANTI-TANK

This cartridge was used in one of the bolt-action, single shot rifles that were trialed by several countries just after the introduction of the tank into warfare near the end of WWI. They didn't last very long as the tanks that they were designed to destroy soon became impervious to their miniscule projectiles. This one is one of the oddities due to its great length and due to its rarity it is now a collector's item.

The weapon for it was developed around 1913 for the Polish Army and it was still in service when WWII commenced. They were captured by the German Army and used by them and the Italians during that war.

The cartridge was produced in an AP-T Tear gas variety similar to that used in the German 7.92x94 anti-tank rifle. It was just as ineffective in the 107mm length case as it was in the 94mm. A blank version was produced with a blue wooden projectile and dummy also exists.
