

9x22R BELGIAN NAGANT

This cartridge was developed circa 1870 and was kept in production by various manufacturers until 1914. It was used in both revolvers and single shot pistols. This style of revolver is well known for its attempt at sealing the gap between cylinder and barrel by permitting the cylinder to move forward on cocking to enclose the forcing cone of the barrel. Never proved to be much superior to any normal revolver and was not adopted by many armies. It is one of the few paper patched pistol rounds to be encountered.
