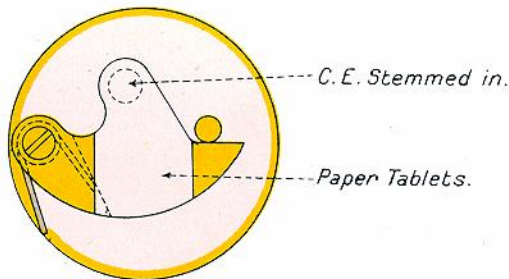
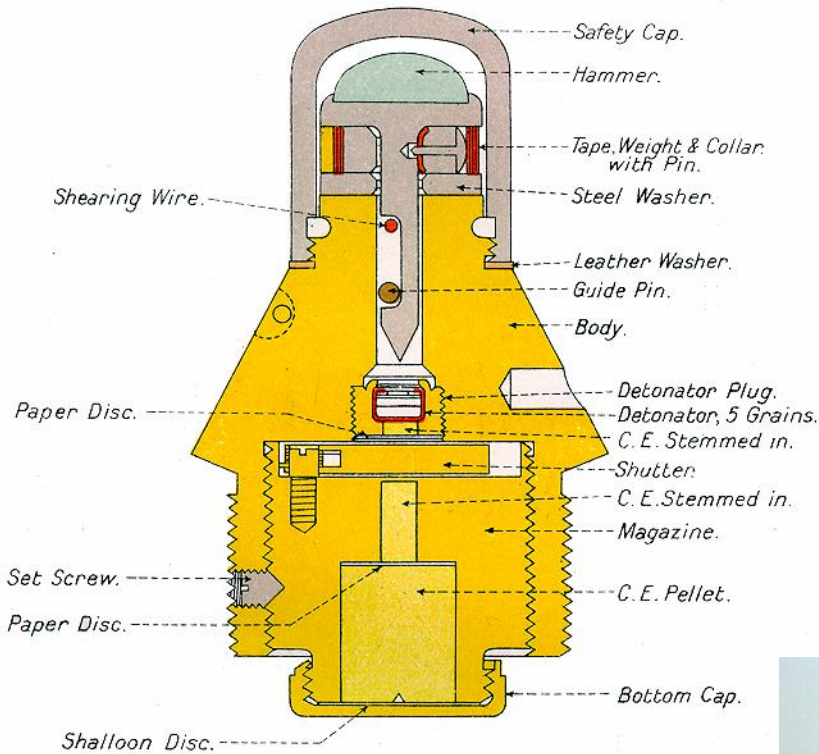
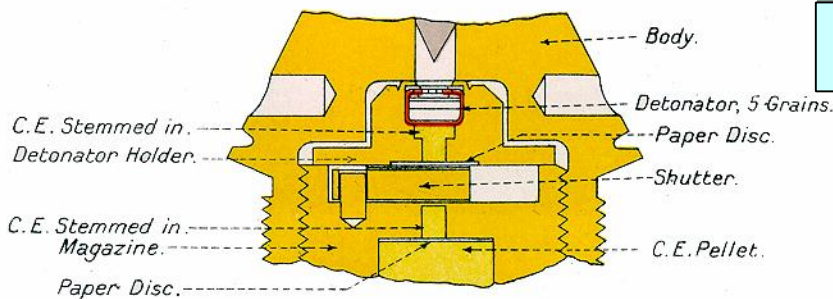


PERCUSSION DA No 106

Introduced in 1917 with the first of the large hammer types restrained in the safe mode by split distance pieces kept in place by a fly-off tape with weight attached. Originally designated at the No. 49 to the old GS gauge but very quickly redesigned to the then new 2-inch gauge. It ran through 27 mark numbers and was declared obsolete in 1934.
